Course Regulations

Course Structure and Duration

The Five - Year B.A LL.B / B.Com. LL.B is a double degree integrated programme.

B.A. LL. B consists of 14 non-Law papers and 31 Law papers spread over five years duration consisting of ten semesters. B.Com. LL. B course consists of 18 non-Law papers and 31 Law papers spread over five years duration consisting of ten semesters.

Each semester shall consist of 90 instructional days having six hours per day including lectures, seminars, moot court, debates, and test papers. There shall be not less than four hours per subject in a week and one/two hours for other additional papers, optional papers, Practical Training, moot courts, seminars, and debates.

Number of Seats

The maximum number of students to be admitted in each course shall be limited to sixty, out of which thirty seats shall be filled through Kerala Law Entrance Examination (KLEE) conducted by the Government of Kerala and remaining thirty seats shall be filled by the management as per institutional norms based on merit.

Mode of Admission

Out of the 60 seats available in a particular class 30 seats are filled through Kerala Law Entrance Examination (KLEE) conducted by the Government of Kerala. The remaining 30 Seats are filled by the management based on the marks scored in the qualifying examination, i.e., Plus Two, under different categories as per the guidelines laid down by the management on the subject.

Eligibility

A candidate who has passed the Higher Secondary or Plus Two examination recognized by the Government of Kerala or any other examination recognized as equivalent thereto by the University of Kerala and has secured not less than

45% of the marks in the aggregate in such examinations shall be eligible to be considered for admission. For SC and ST candidates, the minimum mark required shall be 40% in the aggregate.

Eligibility Certificate

Candidates who have passed the qualifying Higher Secondary Examination from any Board / State other than the State of Kerala shall produce Migration certificate from the concerned university / Board and the Eligibility Certificate of the University of Kerala at the time of admission.

Attendance

No student shall be eligible to appear for the end semester university examinations unless the principal has certified that the candidate has attended not less than 75% of the lectures in each paper and his conduct and progress has been satisfactory.

Paper IV in seventh, eighth, ninth, and tenth semester shall be evaluated internally. Internal viva shall be conducted by the board of examiners constituted by the Principal from among senior teachers.

Examination Rules

There shall be a University Examination at the end of each semester. Each written paper carrying 100 Marks is divided into 80 marks for the external university examination and 20 Marks for the internal assessment.

Internship

Each student shall have completed a minimum of 20 weeks internship during the entire period of legal studies with NGOs, Trial and Appellate Advocates, Judiciary, Legal Regulatory Authorities, Legislative Bodies, Bank, Stock Exchanges, Law firms, Companies, Local Self Government, and such other bodies.

Provided that internship in any particular year should not exceed a continuous period of more than four week and all students shall undergo internship at least once during the entire period of studies with trial and appellate advocates.

Each student shall keep an internship diary which shall be certified and evaluated by the person or authority with whom the student has interned and the same shall be submitted to the Faculty in charge for his evaluation.

Viva-voce examination in the tenth semester shall be conducted by the board of examiners constituted by the university.

Internal Assessment

There shall be a component of internal assessment marks in each paper in all the semesters. The marks for internal assessment shall be awarded by the Course Teacher based on the following guidelines.

- A) Attendance - Five Marks (2.5 marks for 75% of attendance and additional 0.5 marks for every 5% of attendance above 75%)
- B) Test Papers - Five Marks (A minimum of Two Test Papers)
- C) Assignments & presentation - Five Marks
- D) Seminar and Debate - Five Marks

Pass Minimum and Classification

A candidate who obtains not less than 50% of the marks in individual papers in the examination for a semester shall be declared to have passed in the examination of that semester.

A candidate who obtains not less than 50% of the marks in more than one paper, but fails in other papers in a semester is exempted from appearing in the papers in which he/she has obtained pass mark.

A candidate who fails in paper IV of the seventh or eighth or ninth semester shall appear in that paper in the next academic year without obtaining re-admission.

A candidate who fails in internship or viva voce must complete the internship and viva-voce in the next academic year without obtaining re-admission.

There shall be no chance to improve either the internal assessment marks or written examination marks.

Classification of Marks

Distinction - 80% and above

First Class - 60% to 79.9%

Second Class - 50% to 59.9%

Ranking shall be made based on marks obtained by the candidate in the whole examination (Ten Semesters) passed in the first chance.
